All means All

Last Sunday in our worship service at QFMC, Andrew Royer spoke a phrase that has stuck with me. He said, “All means all, and that’s all there is to say.” He was commenting on what it means to give ourselves wholly, rather than partially, to the Lord.

As we approach the week of Good Friday and Easter, my thoughts have turned to the sacrifice that Jesus made on our behalf as a remedy for the penalty of sin. I’ve recalled a story that has helped me understand the Lord’s sacrifice.

The story goes like this.... Richard Manning was born during the depression in Brooklyn, NY. As a young man, he was enlisted in the Marines and trained to fight in the Korean War. After boot camp, he was assigned to ammunition demolition school in Virginia. That’s where he met Ray Brennan who was from the South side of Chicago. Their bond of friendship was forged in the shared experiences of training

and deployment to Korea. On a January night in 1952, with a light snow falling, Richard and Ray shared a bunker. As they shared a chocolate bar and told stories of home, an undetected North Korean soldier threw a grenade into their bunker. Without hesitation, Ray dropped on the grenade and lost his life as it exploded. Richard was unharmed.

After his tour of duty was complete, Richard came home and studied to become a Catholic Priest. In 1960 as he took his vows, he also took a new first name (as was the custom for priests to follow the symbolism of “putting on the new man” as Paul describes in Colossians 3). The name Richard chose as his new legal and spiritual first name was Brennan (Ray’s last name). He did so in hopes that his life and ministry would exemplify the kind of sacrifice that Ray had given for him. Richard, now known as Brennan, also adopted Ray’s mother as his own (although she always referred to him as Richie.)

Years later, while traveling through Chicago, Brennan decided to visit Mrs. Brennan. He regularly did so but this occasion was unplanned. He was prone to depression and was in the midst of an emotional “low tide” when he dropped in on his second mom. After sharing a meal and long conversation, he asked her, “Ma, do you think Ray loved me?” She laughed and quickly told him to stop teasing her. He assured her he wasn’t making fun of her and asked the question again. This time she responded with uncharacteristic anger and told him to “stop it.” Although surprised, Brennan asked the question again. This time she screamed at him, “What more could HE have done for you!?” He was stunned by her response and tried comforting her as she cried and softly repeating her question. Then, after regaining her composure, she said, “That’s ok Richie, I guess we all need some reassurance now and then.”

This event lead Brennan to a life-changing perspective of the love that Jesus had for him. He realized that Jesus gave his “all” for him. He recalled the words that the Lord had said to his own disciples, “Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one’s life for one’s friends.”

So my friend, if you are like Brennan and need some “reassurance now and then,” I want to reassure you that the Lord Jesus loves you. He gave his life for you. He gave his all for you.... and all means all and that’s all there is to say!

My hope is that you would be convinced of the Lord’s all-consuming love and give your all to him as your loving response.


