## Who do you come from?

Who do you come from? Read that question again, slowly. Who, do you come from? Usually, we ask folks “where” they are from, but for the moments that you take to read this blog post, I want to explore the “who” question.

My Aunt Betty never married but had a rich life of friends and faith. She worked for the same accounting firm in Calgary Alberta for more than 30 years. Upon her retirement, she was given a vacation for two, to the destination of her choice. She chose Ireland / England and asked my dad if he would travel with her. During their journey, they investigated our family’s Irish heritage and visited Aldershot where my dad was stationed with the Canadian Army prior to the D-Day invasion.

It was from my Aunt Betty’s research that I learned that our family’s original name was McElnay. It was shortened upon their immigration to Nova Scotia, Canada. I admit that my “ancestral recall” is not extensive, but if you were to ask me “who” I

come from I could tell you that my parents were Jack and June McNay and my grandparents were Thomas and Lena McNay and Roscoe (RJ) and Cora Buckner. My grandparents were born about 80 years before me.

Now you might be able to go back further in your recounting, but the reality is that most of us have a shallow memory of who we are from. And this leads me to a question and statement. First the question; If we can hardly remember people from our own families within a century of our birth, then why do we labor so hard to be remembered by people who most likely will forget us?

My hope is that I might be remembered by my family and friends.

I’m not writing this to have a pity-party. I’m ok with the reality and trend of human memory. I actually find freedom in the thought that I will be forgotten; which brings me to my statement. The longer I live, the more resolve I have to live my life in such a way as to help others remember my master; Jesus Christ. Because, He is truly the only one worthy of glory, honor, and worshipful remembrance.

Oh, and by the way, it is Jesus who I come from. He is my source of origination and my ultimate destination!

It is my hope that you will be known and remembered by Jesus, and live a life that helps others remember Him.

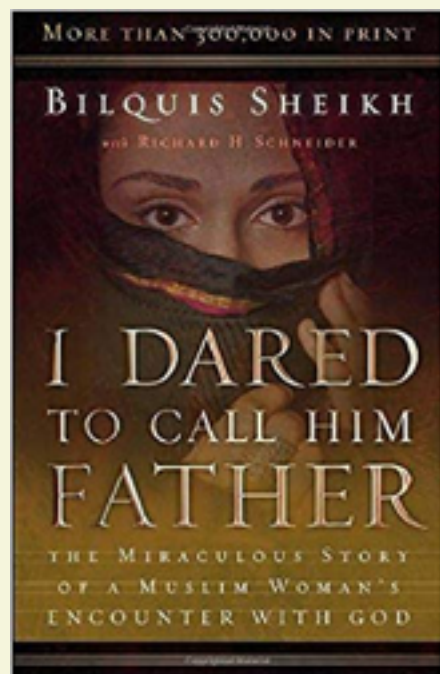
