## Inquiries

One thing have I asked of the LORD, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the LORD and to inquire in his temple. (Psalm 27:4)

In 1976 I was a sophomore at Sentinel High School in Missoula, Montana. One of my favorite teachers was Mr. Nord. He taught history and seemed to actually like not only the subject but the students that he taught. In his Canadian History class, Mr. Nord had to address my inquisitive exuberance, when he instructed me to listen and think before I asked questions. This counsel came after I had hit him with rapid-fire questions that he'd just answered in his lecture. Needless to say, I lacked fully developed focus at that time in my life .... actually, I'm still working on it. Suffice it to say, I am an inquisitive guy; I have a lot of questions.

I've been pondering a scripture this past week that brought to mind Mr. Nord's words

from 43 years ago. King David said this in Psalm 27;

One thing have I asked of the LORD, that will I seek after:  
that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life,  
to gaze upon the beauty of the LORD and to inquire in his temple.

The key phrase is, “to inquire in his temple.” It has me thinking about what question(s) I would ask God if I were to “inquire of Him in His temple.” A couple of questions that surface almost immediately include:

- Why did you wait so long to introduce Jesus to the world?
- Why do some people recognize you right away, and some never seem to?
- Why did you allow Satan to have any power or dominion after he rebelled against you?

I have many other questions of God, but I want to heed Mr. Nord’s counsel and listen and think before I ask all of them. It pleases God when anyone inquires of Him. I don’t think He is scared off if we ask hard questions. He seems willing and able to handle our anger or skepticism.

A dear friend and mentor of mine, prior to becoming a Christian, asked God a question that I will never forget. He was at a low and despondent place in his life. He was close to giving up on life. His prayer/question went something like this: “God, if there is a god, would you make yourself known to me?”

His was a desperately bold prayer/question. Shortly after he “inquired of God” a series of events occurred that led him to be convinced that a) there was, in fact, a God, and b) that God knew him and had a desire to be in a relationship with him. That man eventually went on to lead a large Christian ministry that gave a covering to thousands of people meeting God.

What question(s) would you ask God? Is there anything that is holding you back from approaching God with your inquiries? Please accept my encouragement to “inquire of God.” Go ahead, ask Him your question(s). He can hear you and He can speak to you in a way that you will understand Him.

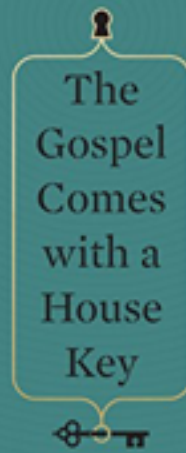
